ON CAMPUS EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR UD STUDENTS

The Career Services Center provides support to students seeking part-time and summer employment opportunities. Many employment opportunities are located on-campus, in the local community, or throughout the mid-Atlantic region. Many of these are available through a database called Blue Hen Careers. All students are automatically registered in this database and can access it from www.udel.edu/CSC.

For students seeking opportunities on-campus, many offices hire students for a wide variety of tasks. These positions are open to all students. This list is not intended to be a complete listing of on-campus employment, but rather includes the <u>larger employers of students</u>. Additional on-campus jobs are listed through Blue Hen Careers.

DINING SERVICES EMPLOYMENT

Registered students are eligible to work for Aramark, the organization that provides Food Service on campus. Available positions include: Food Service Aides, Game Room Attendants, Waitpersons, Relief Drivers and Student Managers. A total of 400 students are hired each year. If you are interested in applying for a position during the school year, you must go to the Dining Services website which is: <u>http://www.udel.edu/dining/jobs/</u> to apply.

RESIDENCE LIFE

Residence Life employs a number of students for openings as Resident Assistants and Security Monitors in the residence halls. Most position start at the beginning of each academic year with other openings occurring at midyear. The application and interview process for Resident Halls occurs the semester before vacancies are available. PUBLIC SAFETY STUDENT WORKERS

The Department of Public Safety, located at 413 Academy Street, hires students to work in their department. Approximately 40 students are employed as <u>Student Aides</u>. These students work approximately 12 hours/week; primarily evenings and weekends. The students work in safety and crime prevention and wear a uniform when on duty. Applications are accepted for <u>Student Aides</u> in the <u>spring</u> and <u>early summer</u> for the following academic year. CARPENTER SPORTS COMPLEX

Carpenter Sports Complex has a variety of needs for students. Some openings in which students may be interested include: I.D. Checkers, Equipment Cage Attendants, Lifeguards, (Certified with Water Safety Instruction) and intramural Officials. The Athletic Department hires most of their employees at the beginning of each semester. If you are interested, you may want to investigate possible openings the semester prior to when you are seeking work. A background or major in physical education is helpful for these jobs. JOHN CLAYTON HALL CONFERENCES AND SPECIAL EVENTS

There are two types of employment available through the Clayton Hall Conference Center, 831-2214. Students are hired through the Conference Center and the Catering Department.

The Conference Center hires about 6-8 students to assist in setting up rooms and doing miscellaneous work in preparation for conference. Most hiring for these positions is done at the beginning of the school year or between academic semesters. Work is generally from 6:00 - 9:30 a.m. and 4:00 - 10:00 p.m. and most students work approximately 15 hours a week. The food service available for special events and conferences at Pencader is provided through the Catering Department, which is located in room 104 Pencader Dining Hall, 831-2891. ADMISSIONS OFFICE

This office hires students for clerical positions, tour guides and the new Student Orientation program.
