University Requirements

- ENGL 110 – Seminar in Composition with a minimum grade of “C-” (3-credits).
- Multicultural Course (3-credits)
- Discovery Learning Experience (DLE) (3-credits). (Note: It is possible to find a multicultural course that will satisfy a Creative Arts & Humanities or History & Cultural Change University breadth requirement below) See the DLE website for more information at udel.edu/gened. HOSP 488 satisfies this requirement.
- Capstone (1 to 3-credits) HOSP 450 satisfies this requirement.
- First-Year-Experience (FYE): BUAD 110 – Basics of Business. Students that are exempt from the FYE requirement or completed an FYE at the University of Delaware prior to becoming a Hospitality Business Management major are not required to take BUAD 110.
- University Breadth Requirements (12-credits) with a minimum grade of “C-”.
All students entering the University of Delaware as of fall 2010 are required to take a minimum of 12-credits of University breadth requirements, 3-credits each from courses designated as: Creative Arts and Humanities, History and Cultural Change, Social and Behavioral Sciences and Mathematics, Natural Sciences and Technology. Students must earn a minimum grade of “C-” or better. *Note that students must take breadth courses from four different areas (e.g., the four letter subject code ACCT, HIST, etc.). Students may not use a course that is cross-listed with a subject area that has already been used to satisfy a university breadth requirement. Students enrolled in a single major may not satisfy the breadth requirement with courses in the subject area of that major (e.g. chemistry majors may not use CHEM courses). Students who are enrolled in more than one major or degree are allowed to meet the University breadth requirement by taking approved breadth courses from within the subject areas of their majors. The requirements are subject to limitations above, however credit hours may be counted only once towards the credit hour minimum required for the degree. - 3-credits – HOSP 230 Executive Presentations and Problem Solving or COMM 212 Oral Communication in Business. *If HOSP 230 is taken, a minimum grade of C- is required.*
- 3-credits of Mathematics – MATH 114, 115, 221 or 241
- 3-credits of Statistics – STAT 200 or MATH 201
- 3-credits of Nutrition – NTD 200 (C- minimum grade)

Free Electives

In addition to the required courses above, sufficient credits must be taken to meet the 120-credit minimum required for the degree with the following restrictions:

- A maximum of 4-credits of 100 and 200-level AFSC/MLSC courses may apply
- HOSP courses taken as a free elective require a C- minimum grade

Degree Requirements (cont'd)

Hospitality-Related Work Experience and Community Service Requirements

- 700 hours of documented hospitality-related work is required
- 100 hours of documented community service is required

During the summer, students are encouraged to complete hospitality-related work hours. At the end of the senior year, 700 hours of hospitality-related and 100 community service hours should be completed and documented at the department office.

Suggested plan for community service hours:

- Prior to sophomore year, 25 hours
- Prior to junior year, 50 hours
- Prior to senior year, 75 hours
- End of senior year, 100 hours
