1-"C-" or better in one of these courses to also satisfy the Mathematics, Natural Sciences & Technology University breadth requirement.

2-Course satisfies the First-Year-Experience (FYE) requirement. Students that are exempt from the FYE requirement or completed an FYE at the University of Delaware prior to becoming an MIS major are not required to take BUAD 110, but will take a free elective instead.

3-Students must select a professional concentration from one (1) of the following areas: Accounting, Economics, Finance, Management, Marketing or Operations Management.

4-Students pursuing the optional Enterprise Systems track should complete MISY 450. Students pursuing the optional Business Analytics track should complete MISY 408. Students that choose not to pursue a track may take either course.

5-Any MISY course 300-level or above fulfills the MISY elective requirement, excluding MISY core requirements. Students pursuing the optional Enterprise Systems track should select two from MISY 305,380, or 427. Students pursuing the optional Business Analytics track should complete BUAD 345 and BUAD 445

6-Course satisfies the Discovery Learning Experience (DLE) requirement.

7-Course satisfies the Capstone requirement.

REQUIREMENTS FOR MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS

(All requirements except free electives must be taken for a letter grade. Pass/Fail status courses may only count in free electives)

University Requirements

- ENGL 110 Seminar in Composition with a minimum grade of "C-" (3-credits).
- Multicultural Course (3-credits)
- First-Year-Experience (FYE): BUAD 110 Basics of Business. Students that are exempt from the FYE requirement or completed an FYE at the University of Delaware prior to becoming an MIS major are not required to take BUAD 110, but will take a free elective instead.
- Discovery Learning Experience (DLE) (3-credits) MISY 431 fulfills this requirement.
- Capstone (1 to 3-credits). MISY 432 fulfills this requirement.
- University Breadth Requirements (12-credits) with a minimum grade of "C-".

All students entering the University of Delaware as of fall 2010 are required to take a minimum of 12-credits of University breadth requirements, 3-credits each from courses designated as: Creative Arts and Humanities, History and Cultural Change, Social and Behavioral Sciences and Mathematics, Natural Sciences and Technology. Students must earn a minimum grade of "C-" or better. Note that students must take breadth courses from four different areas (e.g., the four letter subject code ACCT, HIST, etc.). Students may not use a course that is cross-listed with a subject area that has already been used to satisfy a university breadth requirement. Students enrolled in a single major may not satisfy the breadth requirement with courses in the subject area of that major (e.g. chemistry majors may not use CHEM courses). Students who are enrolled in more than one major or degree are allowed to meet the University breadth requirement by taking approved breadth courses from within the subject areas of their majors. The requirements are subject to limitations above, however credit hours may be counted only once towards the credit hour minimum required for the degree. Note: ECON 101, 103, BUAD 301 and 309 may NOT apply

Mathematics, Natural Sciences and Technology (6-credits)

Note: MATH 201, 221, 230, 241, STAT and CISC courses may NOT apply. Mathematics courses taken to fulfill the Mathematics Skills requirements below may not apply.

Skills (15-credits)

- 6-credits of Mathematics MATH 221 or 241 and MATH 210 or 230 or MATH 241, 242 & 243.
- 6-credits of Statistics STAT 200 and MISY 262.
- 3-credits of Communications COMM 212 or HOSP 230



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Degree Requirements (cont'd)

Free Electives (9-credits)

Free electives include any course subject to the following:

- A maximum of 2-credits of BHAN 120 may be applied
- Excess credits from any category above may be applied
- "0" level courses <u>may not</u> be counted toward the degree
- If a student elects to take an eligible free elective course Pass/Fail, a maximum of one P/F course (3 to 4-credits) may be taken each semester. This is in addition to courses offered only on a P/F basis

Major Required Courses (60-credits)

 Students are required to earn a minimum grade of "C-" in the following courses: ECON 101, 103; ACCT 207, 208; BUAD 301, 306 & 309; FINC 311 and all MISY courses, Professional Concentration courses, and optional track courses if applied to MISY electives.

Students who are enrolled in more than one major or degree are allowed to meet the University breadth requirement by taking approved breadth courses from within the subject areas of their majors. The requirement may be fulfilled through a course or courses taken to complete other degree requirements, subject to the limitations above; however, credit hours may be counted only once towards the credit hour minimum required for the degree.
